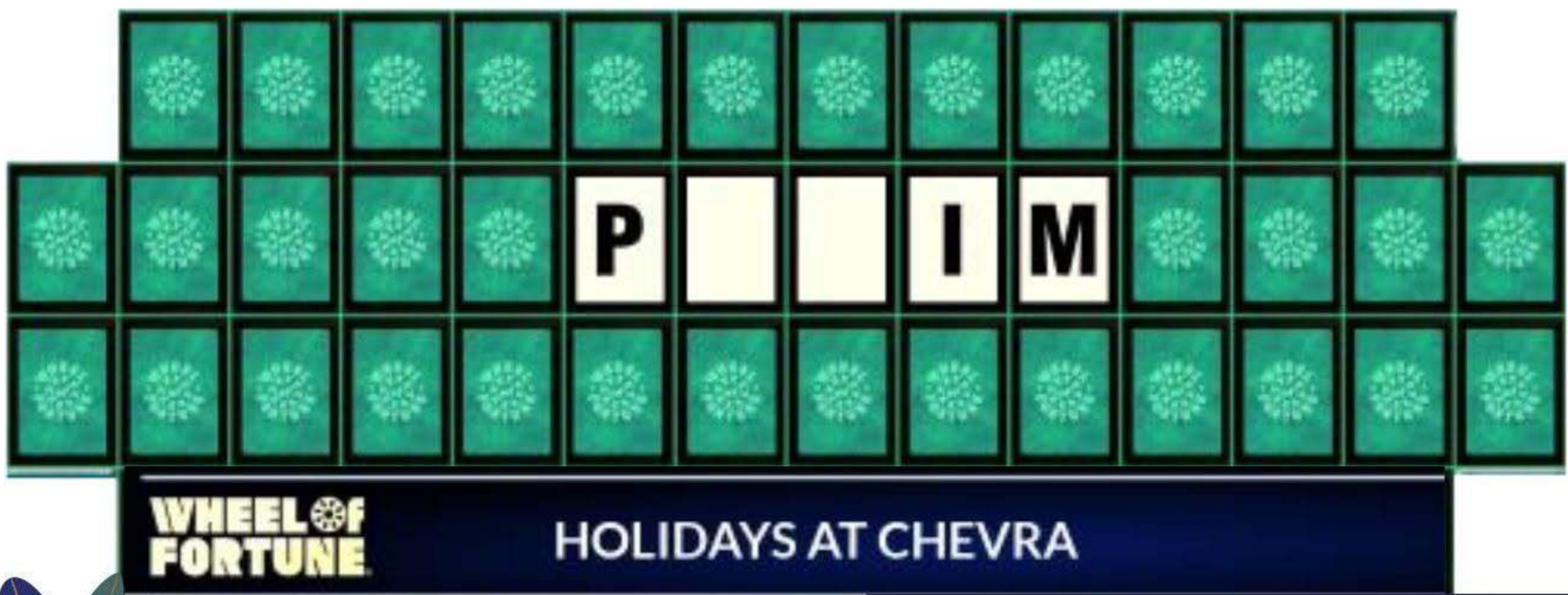

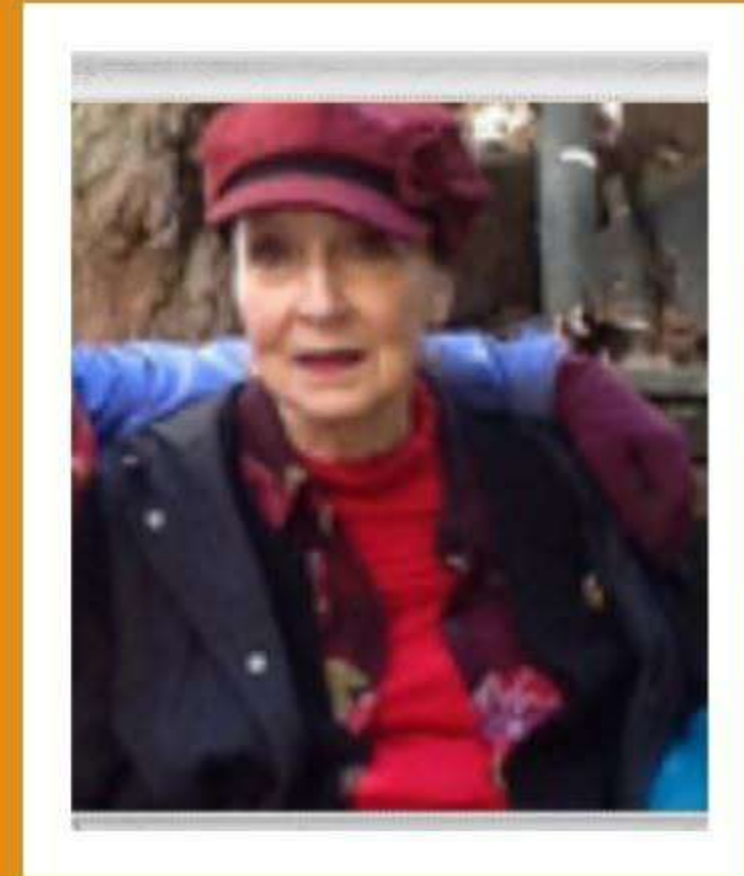
A MESSAGE FROM THE CITY OF GOLD TO THE CITY OF COLD

However, no one minds because the level of the Kinneret is 'way down, and rain is what we've been praying for every Shabbat. Golly I miss you guys and gals; there aren't the friendship vibes at the nearby Shul here, probably because there isn't a Kiddish afterwards like at Chev Mish. The custom here is to go home after the service, then, about 1 pm or so, go to someone's home where you've been invited for lunch....which lasts for around three hours. Fun.....but different.
